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Mark McKeon

Mark specializes in Sustainable Peak Performance, Resilience and Workplace Wellbeing. He is the designer of the innovative 'Every Day Counts' and 'Go Zone' programs.

Mark's background includes 18 years in the AFL first as a Player, then as a High Performance Coach, including 5 years with the Victorian State of Origin Team. Mark is a member of the Collingwood Hall of Fame. He is also the Author of 4 books, with numerous international reprints or translations and one of few Australians with the honour of speaking at the UK XTC.



John Hendry

John Hendry OAM (education and cricket) has spent a lifetime working in education – primarily at Geelong Grammar School where he has made a significant and lasting impact on the culture of the School and has lead the development of GGS's highly regarded Relationship Management model. John contends that institutional culture determines wellbeing and the capacity for each student and teacher to thrive. Wellbeing is fundamentally determined by the capacity to forgive. The focus on kindness and forgiveness provides the way to manage mistakes, resolve conflicts and repair relationships, thereby enhancing wellbeing.

John is now a senior consultant with the Institute of Positive Education based at GGS and is currently working with schools across Australia as well as China and Singapore. He has presented at many conferences including the UNESCO conference on Bullying and School Violence, and the European Commission for Independent Schools on Student and Teacher Wellbeing. He has worked with various elite sporting clubs and the AIS on establishing cultures that enhance athlete health and wellbeing and team performance.

Currently he is a consultant with Resilient Youth Australia. He is working with Andrew Fuller and has developed a Relationship Quotient (RQ) and a model of a resilient mindset. Resilient mindsets can be developed in individuals, in families, in sporting clubs, in schools and business organisations. This work is being done across various communities.



Mary Jean Gallagher

Mary Jean Gallagher was the Assistant Deputy Minister and Chief Student Achievement Officer at the Ministry of Education of Ontario Canada from 2008 to 2015. Through this role she led the delivery of the government's student achievement agenda, including elementary and secondary student success, leveraging her passion for student learning and student achievement.

She has served as the head of the Ontario Literacy and Numeracy Secretariat at the Ministry of Education of Ontario. Prior to this role she was the Director of the Greater Essex County District School Board.

She has had a 35-year career as an educator with roles as a teacher, principal and system leader. Gallagher became board director in 1995, following a career as a math and computer science teacher, principal and superintendent of staffing and development. From 1997-2000 she was seconded by the province as chief executive officer of the Ontario Education Improvement Commission. She has also chaired the Council of Ontario Directors of Education.
