What is Relationship based Education?

Relationship based Education is a philosophy of education that puts relationships at the centre. It is a tool for long-term culture change and for addressing challenges.

The key concepts are:

- Relationships that form in the educational environment are the bedrock for everything else that happens.
- The fundamentals of a positive relationship (Trust, Forgiveness, Integrity, Hope, Compassion) apply to all relationships, including those in the educational environment.

Relationship based Education aims to create a positive, enabling and kind school culture focused on resilience, trust, co-operation and relationship reparation.

What we offer

Our in-school consultancy and workshop program is led by John Hendry OAM. John has many years of experience as an educator, thought leader and consultant. John takes a holistic approach, working with staff, students and parents to create positive and enduring cultural change.

A typical Relationship based Education program in a school will start with a meeting with school leadership to identify your needs, and will include workshops with staff, parents and students.

Workshops and support

The **staff workshop** will introduce the key concepts of Relationship based Education.

John's presentations draw from his many years of experience as an educator and his wide reading and research on the topic to provide an inspiring and thought-provoking experience for staff.

The **parent workshop** will typically be focused on developing trust, to empower parents to be proactive and positive contributors to their children's education.

John will work with **students** on issues such as forming relationships, identifying the elements of a quality relationship and emotional regulation.

John will also provide **support** for schools to put the ideas of Relationship based Education into practice by creating new policies, teaching materials, posters and flyers to create the cultural change they aspire to.

He will also remain available for 'roadside support' to deal with issues that may emerge over time.
